Divine Interruption

2 Chronicles 15: 1 – 7

As believers, we know that God desires to have a relationship with the people whom he has created. But sadly, not all of God's people take him seriously, choosing to reject and stray away from his presence. This is due to a lack of truth, when it comes to the teaching of the word of God. Teaching and preaching the word of God has become an interpretation of what we think, or what we feel is good for the people around us, we have a tendency to speak those things which are popular and preferred. For this reason, God will send his divine disruption to interrupt those things which have become normal and natural in the lives of humanity. This disruption that we experience is divinely given, so that we might focus our attention back on the one who has created us and loves us unconditionally. Now, Old Testament prophecies speak of judgement and wrath which followed after those who were disobedient, those who departed from the presence of the Lord, but with the sacrifice of his Son, Christ Jesus, God has established a relationship with mankind, a relationship that will no longer rain down fire and brimstone or send floods to destroy all of humanity, but it is a relationship that will allow all of mankind to experience the consequences of God, whether it be blessings of good works, or condemnation of disobedience, for as believers we belong to God.

Romans 1: 21 – 23, 10 - 11....when they knew God, they glorified him not as God, neither were thankful....changed the glory of the uncorruptible God into an image made like to corruptible man....but glory, honour, and peace, to every man that worketh good....for there is no respect of person with God....

The word teaches us that even though humanity believes in God, we do not always put our belief in God. We only see what we want to see, we do not see all that God wants us to see, through his word. Therefore, God's word must become the standard by which we conform in order for us to use his word to address every aspect of our lives. The best way for the believer to show God's grace, his mercy, and his love to the world, is to just simply speak the truth of his word. We must learn to speak the fulness of the truth of God's word without apology, but yet we must speak it in his love, his mercy, his grace, and his compassion. Therefore, God judges all people equally based upon truth and applies blessing or judgement accordingly. For he is perfectly just, and he knows the heart, and does not look upon the outward appearances.

So, today we want to take a look at how God uses divine interruption in our life as a believer, so that we might stay focused on his eternal purpose and plan.

2 Chronicles 15: 1 – 7,....and the spirit of God came upon Azariah....and said....the Lord is with you, while ye be with him, he will be found of you, but if ye forsake him, he will forsake you....for a long season....been without the true God....great vexations were upon all the inhabitants of the countries....God did vex them with diversity....be ye strong....for your work shall be rewarded....

So, as believers, difficult situations in our life should force us to think more clearly concerning those circumstances, and our need for the Lord. The problem is that we tend to look at interruptions in our life and take them personally. At some point, we must come to realize that all the things which we work so hard for in this world will come to an end. Therefore, God uses times of interruption in our lives to draw us closer unto him, and to equip us for even more stressful times that lie ahead.

Psalm 61: 2,....from the end of the earth will I cry unto thee, when my heart is overwhelmed, lead me to the rock that is higher than I....

Many things can contribute to our overwhelming sense of anxiety, and worry in life, but rest assured God is the one in control. Therefore, we must be willing to trust that he will continue to work a work that is good, even from whatever controversy that is upon us. Now, even though we might never fully understand the moment in time of God's purpose and plan for our life that we are going through, his faith in us, and our faith in him will sustain us. These interruptions that God allows to take place in our life, he allows, so that he might show unto us that he will use even the smallest amount of faith to work miraculous things in our heart.

Matthew 17: 19 – 20,....then came the disciples to Jesus....and said, why could we not cast him out?....and Jesus said....because of your unbelief....if ye have faith as a grain of mustard seed, ye shall say unto this mountain, remove hence to yonder place, and it shall remove, and nothing shall be impossible unto you....

One of the first things that we must come to realize is that when these interruptions take place in our life, if we do not immediately turn unto God, then it will become our tendency to take even the smallest of trials and tribulations and turn them into mountains that are impossible for us to overcome. One thing that we must remember is that God promises unto us that through our obedience to his word, he will not suffer us to be tempted beyond that which we are able to bear.

1 Corinthians 10: 13,....there hath no temptation taken hold of you but such as is common to man....but God is faithful, he will not suffer you to be tempted beyond that which ye are able to bear....

That's right, God does not tempt us, but he will allow us to be tempted, and yes, he allows the trials and tribulations that we are going through in our life, so that our faith will grow, and so that we might mature in our life in Christ.

James 1: 13,....let no man say when he is tempted, I am tempted of God, for God cannot be tempted with evil, neither tempteth he any man....

If we are to successfully serve Christ, then we must rely upon his strength and not our own, and this comes through our faith in him. The quality of our faith is more important than professing a quantity of faith. Faith is not just believing in Christ, it is completely, wholly, and unconditionally depending upon him. Instead of making the interruptions in life out to be something greater than we can bear, we should focus upon the greatness of God. So, as believers, we know the power that God has given unto us, power which comes through faith believing in the promises of his word, therefore, let us not fail to use it.

1 John 4: 4,....ye are of God little children....because greater is he that is in you, than he that is in the world....

Through the grace and mercy of God, we have been transformed from an earthly position in the world, to a heavenly position in Christ. But there is much, much more, for we have been given the gift of the Holy Spirit who now permanently indwells within us, to lead us and to guide us. So, if we will allow this great gift to work within us, even though we may not always understand the interruptions in our life, we will understand that God has allowed these situations and circumstances to happen, and since he has allowed them, if we will seek after his will, he will use these conditions, not only for our spiritual growth, but also for the glory of his salvation within others. So, we must learn to see and accept these blessings of divine interruption that God allows to take place in our life, so that in all that we do, we do it all for the glory of God.
