I am The Voice of Christ

John 1: 19 – 23

Hebrews 10: 16 – 17,....this is the covenant that I will make with them....I will put my word in their hearts, and in their mind I will write them....and their sins....will I remember no more....

One of the greatest gifts that God gives unto us as believers is the ability to share the gospel of his saving grace with others. Through preaching, through teaching, through testimony, by our actions as a living testimony to others, we proclaim Christ and the crucifixion. Now, whether we believe it to be true or not, as God prepares the heart, when we speak people will listen, therefore, we must use the gifts that God has given unto us to: shape peoples understanding of the gospel, to comfort others sorrows, to encourage others, to inspire others, to teach others, all this to point others in the way to Christ. So, we must acknowledge that this unique gift that we have from God, has nothing to do with our own self-righteousness, but has everything to do with our good works, for his eternal purpose. By the strength that God gives unto us through the power of his indwelling Holy Spirit we find the confidence and the courage to walk through doors that he opens for us, so that we might communicate the message of his gospel, which he gives unto us, for every opportunity that he has prepared us for. Our gift to communicate unto others is specific to what God has taught us through the wisdom, knowledge, and understanding of his word. So, God has put his word in our heart, because the world needs to hear the message of salvation, and it is our willing service unto him to share the testimony which he has instilled within us, by his saving grace.

John 1: 19 – 23,....this is the record of John, when the Jews....ask him....who art thou? And he confessed....I am not the Christ....and they ask him....art thou Elias?....art thou that prophet?....and he answered, no....then said they unto him, who art thou?....he said, I am the voice of one crying in the wilderness, make strait the way of the Lord....

As believers, we have committed ourselves to the responsibility of becoming a voice for Christ. We are now the voice for Christ. A voice that brings awareness of his word to all those who will respond willingly to it. Now, this awareness that we bring is not a new revelation, but it is a fulfillment of what has already taken place, so there is no need for any extravagant, profound, exhibition to present it unto others, it just needs to be presented in spirit and in truth. We are simply a voice, a messenger of God, nothing more, and nothing less, one who is proclaiming the coming of Christ, and announcing the promise that today is the day of his salvation.

2 Corinthians 6: 2 – 3,....for he saith, I have heard thee in a time accepted, and in the day of salvation have I succeeded thee, behold, now is the accepted time, behold now is the day of salvation....giving no offense in anything, that the ministry be not blamed....

Part of being a voice for Christ is to encourage one another to remove anything and everything in our lives that might hinder our walk with the Lord. Even though the world does not recognize or acknowledge it, the invitation to be reconciled unto God, through the crucifixion and resurrection of his Son, is a limited time offer. This invitation to accept the saving grace of Jesus Christ should not be portrayed as something that will happen someday, but it should be portrayed with the urgency of something that could take place today. Eventually time will run out and eternity will begin, so there should be no hesitation when it comes to putting our complete faith and trust in Christ, while portraying the gospel of God's saving grace. Today the voice of one crying in the wilderness is the church, all of us who are members of the body of Christ, those who profess the saving grace of Jesus Christ, and for this reason we proclaim that we are much closer to the Lord's return than when we first believed.

Romans 13: 11 – 14,....knowing the time....now is our salvation nearer than when we believed....let us therefore cast off the works of darkness....let us put on the armour of light....let us walk honestly....put ye on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make not provision for the flesh, to fulfill the lusts thereof....

Every day that passes we are one day closer to our eternal life with Christ. This means that throughout our life as a believer our focus should always be on Christ, and as the time of his return draws closer, the urgency to wake up, which comes by the convicting power of the indwelling Holy Spirit, who is encouraging us to see that there are still multitudes of people that need God's saving grace. So let us fervently seek to use the time that we have left on this earth, wisely, and alert, and with a willing desire to proclaim to the world God's saving grace. The Lord's Passover signifies a type of his coming for the church.

Exodus 12: 11,....thus ye shall eat it, with your loins girded, your shoes on your feet, and your staff in your hand, ye shall eat it in haste, it is the Lord's Passover....

The word of God encourages us to live daily in the awareness of God's presence, for every moment in our life in Christ is a moment of opportunity. Our understanding of the Lord's return is going to motivate us to live in the awareness and fullness of our salvation. Keeping ourselves just and pure, with an eager expectation of Christ's appearing for his word gives unto us the confidence in our life in Christ to always be found faithful in our love for him.

1 Thessalonians 5: 5 – 11,....ye are all children of light....therefore let us not sleep....but let us watch and be sober....let us....putting on the breastplate of faith and love, and for an helmet, the hope of salvation....for God hath not appointed us to wrath, but to obtain salvation by our Lord Jesus Christ, who died for us....wherefore comfort yourselves together, and edify one another....

Being children of God, means that he has given unto his word, for wisdom and for knowledge, to understand that we should be well equipped to recognize the signs of the times in which we live, looking for the return of Christ at any day. Now, because we are positioned in Christ, we have responsibilities, and therefore we are not to participate in the foolish works of the flesh, but we are to carry out the promises of God's word, which will show unto us the way in which we must go, and will guide us into all truth. Our salvation consists of faith, and hope and love, which is our faith in God, it is our love for his Son, and it is our hope of eternal life. Therefore, the responsibility of our salvation is to be watchful, while diligently labouring for the work of the Lord.

1 Corinthians 16: 13 – 14,....watch ye, stand fast in the faith, quit you like men, be strong....let your things be done with love....

Every believer should come to know and experience the importance of watching and being alert for the coming of the Lord, because the enemy of our soul seeks to compromise our faith through false teachings and deceitful works. So, we are called to be strong in the Lord and in the power of his might, and we are not to compromise our faith, but we are to hold fast to that which is good, that which is steadfast and immovable, for we will be faced with many oppositions in our life, therefore, we must make it our goal to understand the salvation which we believe, and more importantly we must understand the one in whom we have believed in. Our life in Christ requires spiritual endurance, so our faith must be unwavering as we mature, and we must be rooted and grounded, established, and anchored in Christ and his word.

1 Peter 3: 15 - 16,....sanctify the Lord God in your hearts....be ready always to give an answer to everyman that asketh you a reason of the hope that is in you....having a good conscience....

Becoming a voice for Christ means having a readiness to answer anyone who ask about our faith in Christ and our trust in God. We should always be prepared, by being equipped with the word of God, to speak of the blessed hope that gives salvation unto whosoever will call upon the name of the Lord. Now, persecution and suffering are to be expected in these situations and circumstances in our life in Christ, but our response to the suffering should be one that will point others unto Christ. We must reflect Christs teachings of compassion, all the while speaking the truth of his word in love.

Ephesians 4: 15 – 16,....speaking the truth in love....maketh increase of the body unto the edifying of itself in love....

As believers, we all serve the same Lord, and we all are a part of the same body of Christ. So, becoming a voice for Christ means communicating unto others, and encouraging others to build up a spiritual life in Christ according to their need. We are to speak the truth, not just because we know the truth, but because we have a godly love for those whom we are speaking unto, for we have a desire that all might believe upon Christ, and not perish, but have everlasting life. Remember this, our voice for Christ may very well be someone's guide to salvation.
